## Returning Student Devices

Student devices include Chromebooks, iPads, Windows laptops or tablets, and hotspots. Please see below for timelines of returning student devices.

1. All 12th-grade students need to return their device(s) prior to graduation ceremonies.
2. All students who have unenrolled or are transferring outside the district need to return their device(s) on the last day of school. Schools will not transfer the student's file to another school until the device has been returned.
3. All PreK through 11th-grade students who are not unenrolling or transferring will keep their devices throughout the summer and into fall 2021 so learning can continue into the summer. *Students transitioning from elementary to middle school and middle to high school will still keep their devices for the summer.*

### Online Learning Tools Available Over the Summer

Students will continue to have access to online learning tools over the summer through August 6. On August 6, our technology services department will begin transitioning students in our student information system to their new teachers and grades for the 2021-22 school year. This means students will not have access to our online learning tools after August 6 until the new school year begins. Students can access these tools to support and continue their learning through August 6.

## Summer School

Highline's summer school programs are an opportunity for students to strengthen and build upon their knowledge, makeup credits, and keep their minds active during summer break.



The elementary and middle school programs will provide students with an opportunity to practice and build upon their literacy and math skills, as well as engage in social-emotional

learning. Ninth-grade students will focus on their language arts skills and social-emotional learning. Students in grades 10-12 will be able to gain credit in order to stay on track to graduate.

All programs will be offered in person this summer. We will use 3-foot spacing between students and staff, and follow public health recommendations on masks and other safety measures. If your student is unable or unwilling to attend in person, we can provide a distance-learning alternative.

Students who need additional support and/or are behind in credits are invited to register for a summer learning program.

Household with income that that does not exceed 50% of the area median income

One or more people in the household have had their income directly or indirectly impacted by COVID-19

One or more people in the household can show they are unstably housed, including being behind on rent, utilities or an eviction notice.

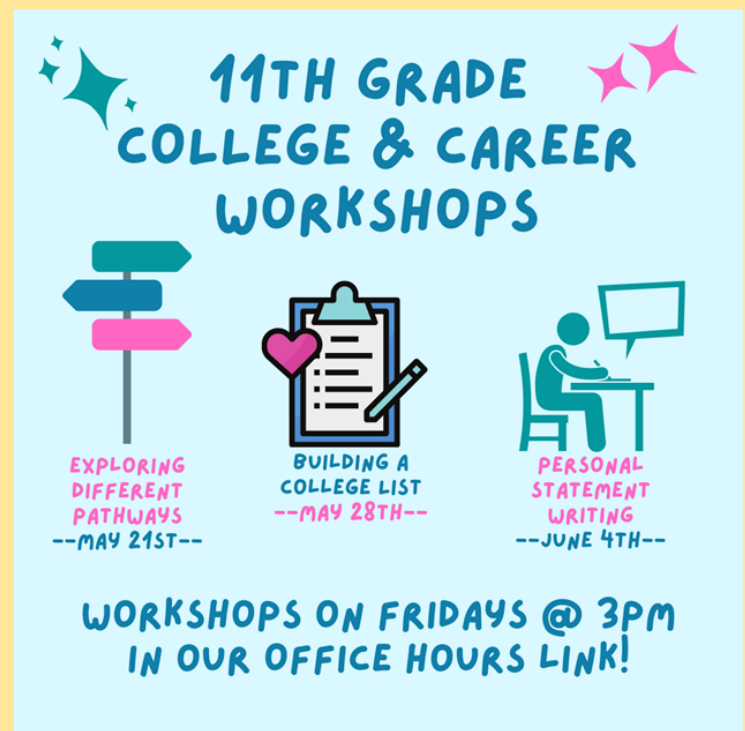

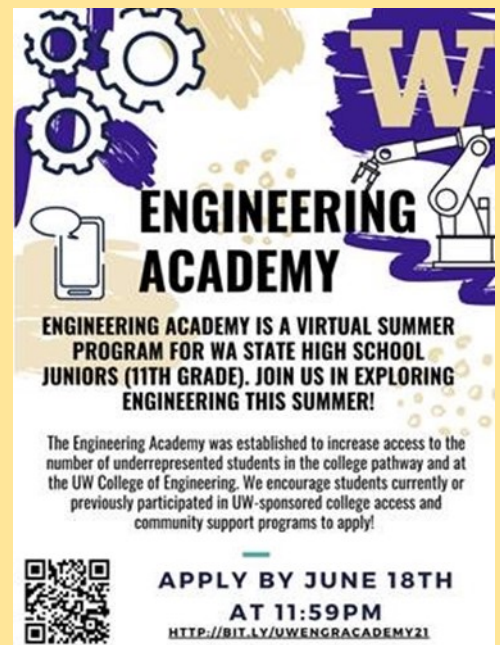
