

Hello Tyee Families,





MESSAGE FROM ADMIN, IN CASE YOU MISSED IT LAST WEEK

Tyee families,

Beginning Tuesday, January 2, 2022, Tyee High School will be implementing a revised tardy policy and new fragrance-free policy.

Tardy Policy

- Students with **7 or more tardies** (collectively from periods 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and advisory) will be assigned to our "Titan Time" after school program. The number of tardies has changed from 10 to 7.
- Families will still be notified via robocalls. Students will be notified via a pass given to them by their advisor.
- Students will continue to complete a reflection sheet and have a discussion with the staff member supervising the space about how to not be tardy to their classes.
- Titan Time will also be moving from Thursdays to Tuesdays from 2:45PM-4:15PM so that we have the proper staffing to supervise. This change will be effective starting the week of January 9th.

Fragrance-Free Policy

- Due to the health and safety of our students on campus, Tyee will now be a **fragrance-free campus**. This means all teachers, students, and staff members are not to bring cleaning products, deodorizers, fragrance sprays, perfume, or other personal care products into the classroom unless they are identified as fragrance-free.
- Students, families, and staff will be notified if strong scented materials are going to be used on campus.
- If a student or staff is affected by a specific scent, we ask that school staff eliminate the cause of the odor.

The changes outlined above reflect our commitment to the safety and success of all our students at Tyee. We will be communicating these changes to our students but also please communicate these changes to your student(s) at home.

A partir del martes 2 de enero de 2022, Tyee High School implementará una política revisada de tardanzas y una nueva política libre de fragancias.

Política de Tardanzas

- Los estudiantes con **7 o más tardanzas** (colectivamente de los períodos 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 y de asesoramiento) serán asignados a nuestro programa extracurricular "Titan Time". El número de tardanzas ha cambiado de 10 a 7.
- Las familias seguirán siendo notificadas a través de llamadas automáticas. Los estudiantes serán notificados a través de un pase que les dará su asesor.
- Los estudiantes continuarán completando una hoja de reflexión y tendrán una discusión con el miembro del personal que supervisa el espacio sobre cómo no llegar tarde a sus clases.
- Titan Time también cambiará de jueves a martes de 2:45pm-4:15pm para que tengamos el personal adecuado para supervisar. Este cambio será efectivo a partir de la semana del 9 de enero.

Política sin fragancia

- Debido a la salud y seguridad de nuestros estudiantes en el campus, ahora Tyee será un **campus libre de fragancias**. Esto significa que todos los maestros, estudiantes y miembros del personal no deben traer productos de limpieza, desodorantes, fragancias en aerosol, perfumes u otros productos de cuidado personal al salón de clases a menos que estén identificados como libres de fragancia.
- Se notificará a los estudiantes, las familias y el personal si se van a utilizar materiales con olores fuertes en el campus.
- Si un estudiante o personal se ve afectado por un olor específico, le pedimos al personal de la escuela que elimine la causa del olor.

Los cambios descritos anteriormente reflejan nuestro compromiso con la seguridad y el éxito de todos nuestros estudiantes en Tyee. Estaremos comunicando estos cambios a nuestros estudiantes, pero también comunique estos cambios a sus estudiante(s) en casa.

Washington State Opportunity Scholarship

(WSOS) (due 2/28) -- WSOS provides up to \$22,500 in financial aid support and access to career-launching support services for students pursuing high-demand STEM and health care majors. This scholarship can be used to cover tuition, fees and other indirect costs of attendance such as housing, transportation, food and more. Funding can be used for any eligible STEM or health care degree at any eligible public or private college or university in Washington state.

•<u>HearthStone Scholarship</u> (due 3/1) -- For low-income seniors with a 3.0 GPA+. Tell us about how pursuing higher education will help you to achieve your personal and professional goals

• Washington State School Retirees' Association Scholarship (Due March 1st) Contains two scholarships: Robert J.
