Hello Tyee Community!



Tyee High School is on the Highline Schools Bond

In November, Highline Public Schools is asking voters to consider a bond that will provide improvements to schools across the district.

This bond will rebuild three schools: **Tyee High School**, Evergreen High School and Pacific Middle School. It will also fund critical improvements, like roofing, painting, carpet and emergency repairs — at other schools. If passed in November students will move into the new, replaced **Tyee High School in the fall of 2025!**

This bond is **not expected to increase taxes for most homeowners**, due to expiring school taxes and a decreasing tax rate.

Proposition 1: Highline Schools Bond will continue Highline's commitment to replace our aging school buildings with schools built to today's safety standards, equipped for today's learning.

También financiará las mejoras críticas como los techos, pintura, alfombras y reparaciones de emergencia en todas las escuelas. ¡Si pasa en noviembre, los estudiantes se mudarán al nuevo Bachillerato Tyee en el otoño del 2025!

No se espera que este bono aumente los impuestos para la mayoría de los propietarios de viviendas, debido al vencimiento de los impuestos escolares y una tasa impositiva decreciente.

La proposición 1: Bono para las Escuelas de Highline continuará el compromiso de Highline de reemplazar nuestras viejas escuelas con instalaciones modernas y seguras, equipadas para el aprendizaje del siglo XXI.

- Act Six Scholarship (due Nov. 15th) -- For students with leadership experience interested in attending a private college in WA (including: PLU, Whitworth, Gonzaga, Saint Martins U, Northwest U)
- <u>Pride Foundation Scholarship</u> (due Jan 6th) --- Pride Foundation provides essential financial resources and community support to LGBTQ+ student leaders across the Northwest.
- Ron Brown Scholarship (due Jan 9th) --- For Black/African-American students who are the most talented and economically-challenged high school seniors who demonstrate a keen interest in public service, community engagement, business entrepreneurship and global citizenship
