Tyee is beyond excited to house the WELS program on our campus.






The woodshop has been making big improvements lately and adding new equipment under the guidance of teacher Brian Hewitt.



Scholarships

•Leadership1000: (due Jan 31st) - \$5000 per academic year.

•Governor's Scholarship for Foster Youth (due Jan 31st) -- The Washington State Governors' Scholarship for Foster Youth is a scholarship program that helps young men and women from foster care continue their education and earn a college degree.

•Women's University Club Foundation Scholarship (due 2/14) -- Apply on Washboard.com

•ACPE Scholarship (due 2/20) -- Are you planning to study technology next year? Apply now for a \$3,000 scholarship from ACPE. Successful applicants have studied and used technology in innovative ways throughout their high school career and can demonstrate their work through a project. The project itself can take many forms, including but not limited to a website, app, video, podcast, webcast, etc., produced sometime during their high school years.

•Washington State Opportunity Scholarship (WSOS) (due 2/28) -- WSOS provides up to \$22,500 in financial aid support and access to career-launching support services for students pursuing high-demand STEM and health care majors. This scholarship can be used to cover tuition, fees and other indirect costs of attendance such as housing, transporta-

tion, food and more. Funding can be used for any eligible STEM or health care degree at any eligible public or private college or university in Washington state.

- Washington State School Retirees' Association Scholarship (Due March 1st) Contains two scholarships: Robert J. Handy/WSSR Foundation Scholarships and Gene Forrester Memorial Scholarship for students with a GPA of 3.0 or higher and who will major in Agricultural Education at Washington State University.
- •<u>2023 Horatio Alger Scholarship Application</u> (Due March, 15) the Horatio Alger Association seeks students who have exhibited determination, integrity, and perseverance in overcoming adversity, as well as have critical financial need.
